MINE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT, ACT NO. 29 OF 1996

The employer's attention is drawn to the requirements of Section 2.(1)(b) of the Mine Health and Safety Act. (Act No 29 of 1996, as amended), which states that, a mine must be operated in such a way that employees can perform their work without endangering the health and safety of themselves or of any other person.

The employer of every mine that is being worked must therefore prepare and implement a health and safety management system, which includes, but is not limited to, adequate management and supervision: fatigue management; alcohol and drug testing; as well as all other necessary operational requirements as per the risk assessment process.

NOTE

EXTRACTS FROM THE REGULATIONS OF THE NOW- REPEALED MINERALS ACT, STILL IN FORCE IN TERMS OF SCHEDULE 4 OF THE MINE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT

- "Reg 3.3 Every permission or a copy thereof granted by the Chief Inspector of Mines under section 9 of the Act shall be posted up in a suitable place at the mine or works."
- "Reg. 3.8.1 (Renewals of Notice). So often, as any posted notice or copy thereof become defaced, obliterated or destroyed it shall be renewed with all reasonable despatch."
- "Reg. 3.8.2 (Interfering with notices). No unauthorised person shall remove or deface any of the before mentioned notices or copies thereof."
